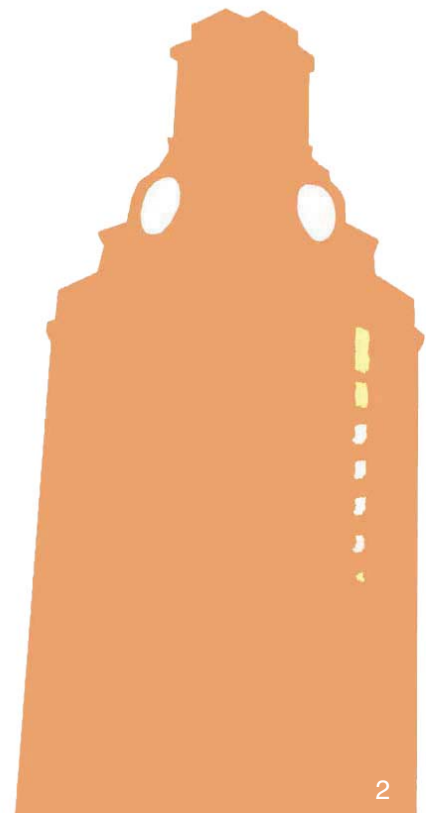

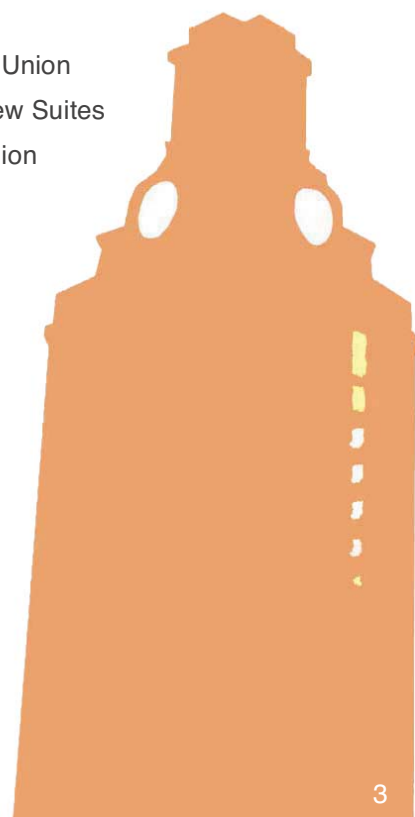

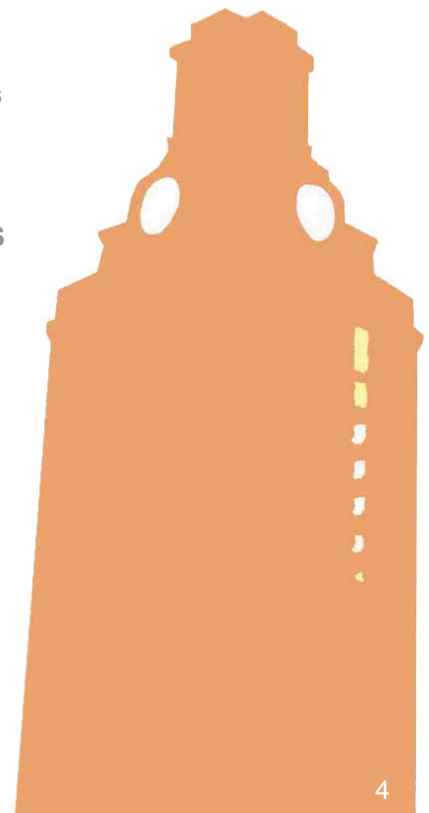

Undergraduate Degrees

Bachelor of Architecture

A five-year professional degree plan; features a rigorous design-oriented curriculum with a solid foundation in building science and the history and theory of architecture

Bachelor of Architecture/Bachelor of Science in Architectural Engineering Dual Degree Program

A six-year, double professional degree program

Bachelor of Science in Architectural Studies

A four-year pre-professional degree plan; an excellent platform for graduate study in architecture, engineering, law, and business or interior, graphic, and industrial design

Bachelor of Science in Interior Design

A four-year pre-professional degree that parallels the architecture studio education, while retaining a clear viewpoint on interior architecture and the other design arts

Graduate Degrees

Masters of Architecture (first professional)

Fulfills the professional degree requirements for registration as an architect

Masters of Architecture (post-professional)

Offers advanced study in an area of concentration: historic preservation, design with climate, advanced architectural design, or urban design

Master of Arts in Architectural History

Provides students with an introduction to advanced studies in Architectural History

Masters and Ph.D. of Community and Regional Planning

Provides theoretical foundations, specific skills, and practical experience

Masters of Landscape Architecture

Study in protecting and fostering the natural environment to implement new landscapes that are both aesthetically pleasing and ecologically sustainable

Masters of Science in Architectural Studies

A nonprofessional academic degree offering concentrations in historic preservation, sustainable design, urban design, architectural history, and interdisciplinary studies

Master of Science in Sustainable Design

Study in the relationship between the built and natural environments

Master of Science in Urban Design

Prepares students for advanced work in the practice of urban design

Masters of Science and Ph.D. in Historic Preservation

Study in the preservation of significant buildings, cultural landscapes, and historic districts

Ph.D. in Architectural History

Prepares students to teach and conduct research at the highest level
